 As of 3rd March 2016, the estimated number of civilians seeking safety in six Protection of Civilians (PoC) sites located on UNMISS bases is **195,343** including 124,055 in Bentiu, 40,115 in Malakal, 27,950 in Juba UN House, 2,289 in Bor, 700 in Melut and 234 in Wau.
