### UNMISS “PROTECTION OF CIVILIANS” (PoC) SITES <sup>1</sup>

- As of 1 October, the estimated number of civilians seeking safety in six Protection of Civilians (PoC) sites located on UNMISS bases is 184,282 including 107,649 in Bentiu, 27,950 in Juba UN House, 45,462 in Malakal, 2,289 in Bor, 700 in Melut and 232 in Wau.
