### *CIVILIANS PROTECTED ON UNMISS BASES*

#### Overview of civilians protected in UNMISS Bases – 7 January

- **58,409 civilians are seeking protection in 10 UNMISS bases** including 29,464 in Juba, 8,800 in Bentiu, 9,000 in Bor and 10,000 in Malakal
- In Juba, **primary schools exams are held in UNMISS two protection sites** from 13 to 17 January. The United Nations Children Fund (UNICEF), UNMISS and other key partners are ensuring that 341 children registered by UNMISS (254 in Tomping and 87 in UN House - 42 girls) will be able to take their exams. UNMISS is committed to providing protective space for the children during the exam.

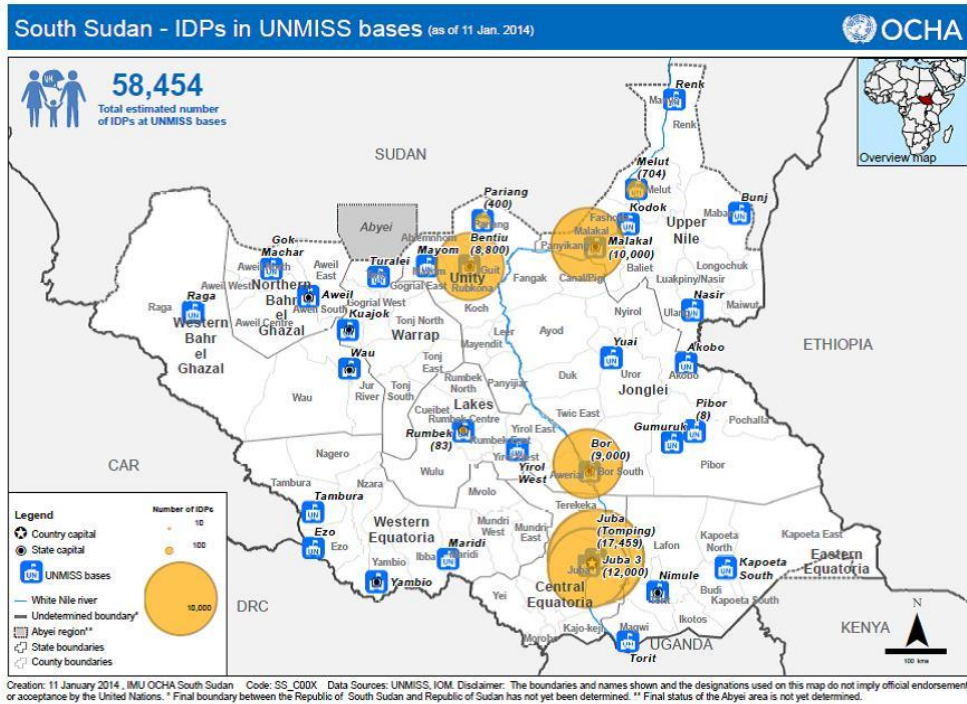

## UPDATE



### REINFORCEMENTS

On 24 December 2013, the UN Security Council decided that UNMISS would be reinforced in its military and police components, respectively up to 12,500 troops (additional 5,500) and **up to 1,323 police (additional 423 police)**. It also encouraged “inter-mission cooperation” so troops and needed assets can be transferred from other UN missions to UNMISS (UN Resolution 2132).

**Police:** 252 police have now arrived and been deployed in Juba, Malakal, Bentiu and Bor including two Police Formed Units (FPU) and an advanced party of 6 for the third expected FPU.

### Inter-mission support

- A medical surgical team was provided by the United Nations Operation in Côte d'Ivoire (ONUCI)
- 3 MI-17 and one MI-26 helicopters were provided by the United Nations Organization Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUSCO)
