### UNMISS “PROTECTION OF CIVILIANS” (PoC) SITES <sup>1</sup>

- As of 27 August, the estimated number of civilians seeking safety in six Protection of Civilians (PoC) sites located on UNMISS bases is 201,911 including 121,194 in Bentiu, 28,663 in Juba UN House, 48,840 in Malakal, 2,289 in Bor, 723 in Melut and 202 in Wau.
