UNMISS "PROTECTION OF CIVILIANS" (POC) SITES I

• As of 28 May, the estimated number of civilians seeking safety in six Protection of Civilians (PoC) sites located on UNMISS bases is 130,486 including 61,976 in Bentiu, 34,420 in Juba UN House, 30,410 in Malakal, 2,374 in Bor, 944 in Melut and 362 in Wau.
