UNMISS "PROTECTION OF CIVILIANS" (PoC) SITES I

- As of 5 August, the estimated number of civilians seeking safety in ten Protection of Civilians (PoC) sites located on UNMISS bases is 95,532, including 31,940 in Juba (Tompson and UN House), 17,119 in Malakal, 4,123 in Bor, 40,574 in Bentiu, 563 in Wau, 1,174 in Melut, 28 in Nasser, and 11 in Rumbek.

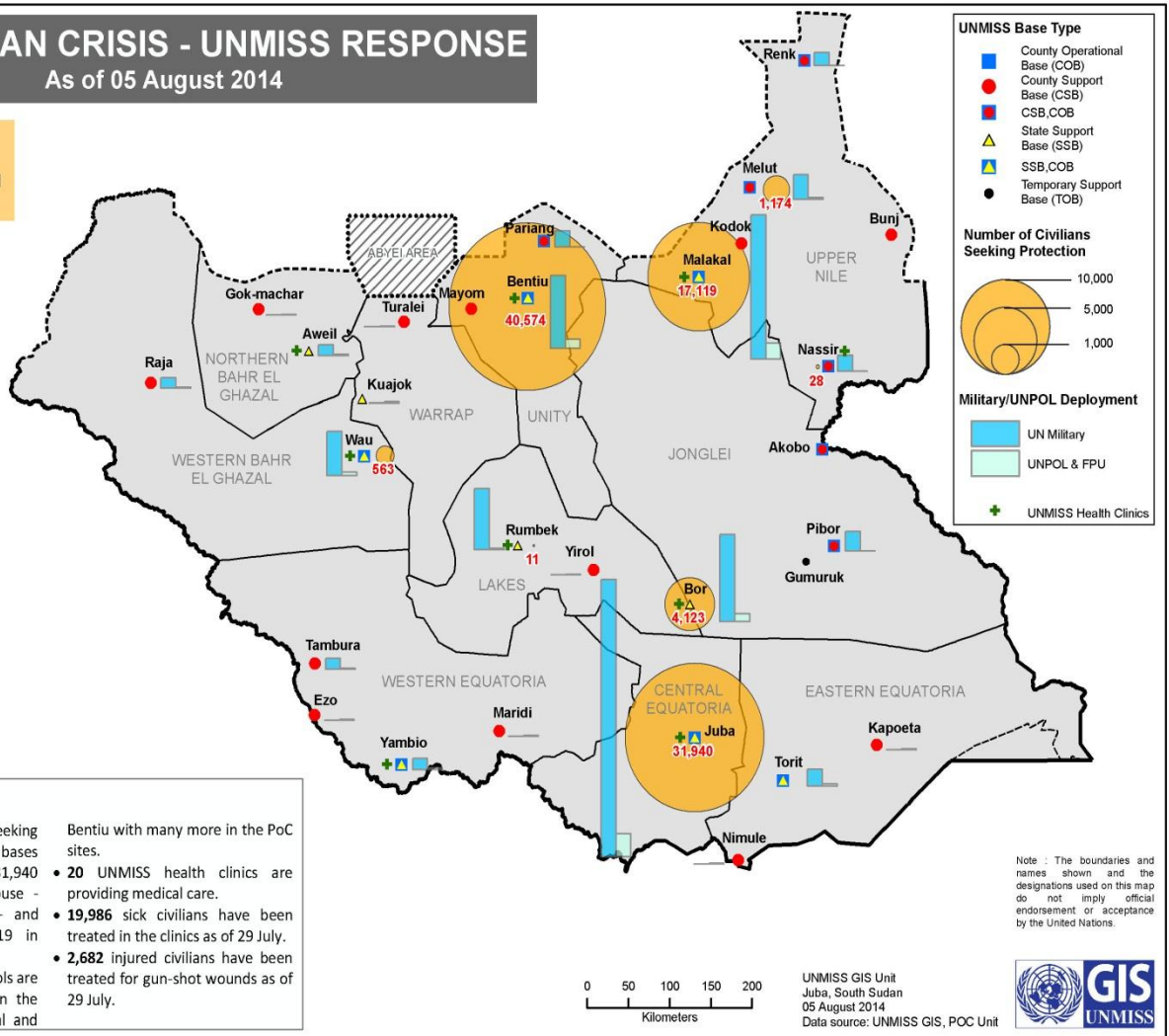

Juba, UN House and Tomping sites

Tomping

- As of August 4, a total of 5,101 internally displaced persons have been relocated to PoC 3.

UN House

- Commencing the first week of August, UN Police will conduct training for forty internally displaced persons on Sexual Gender Based Violence.
- Recovery Reintegration and Peacebuilding Section of UNMISS have launched sensitization messages on Boda Boda Talk Talk about fence breaching as well as taking food out and bringing in furniture.

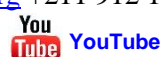
SECURITY AND PATROLS
